



## Rev. Leonard Bryant

March 12, 1935 - March 31, 2026

On March 12, 1935, Linton (Leonard) Bryant entered this world with a quiet strength

through the bodily vessel of the late Charlie “Clus” and Amanda “Mandy” Pearl Bryant.

As the youngest of their second set of twins, he was affectionately called “Lil Bae”.

Growing up in a home filled with love, music, and deep-rooted faith, he quickly fit right in.

He joined the choir, served faithfully on the usher board, and found purpose in every role

he took on. It was during these formative years that he accepted Christ into his life under

the leadership of Rev Garrett at Green Chapel Missionary Baptist Church — a decision

that shaped his character and planted the seeds of the calling he would one day fulfill.

Leonard joined the military at the age of 22, where he carried the same discipline,

seriousness, and sense of responsibility that had defined him since boyhood.

But he quickly returned home to marry the love of his life, Mary Helen Dumas, on

October 6, 1957. A connection that started in church, at the age of fifteen,

grew steadily

into a lifelong partnership where they raised four beautiful girls.

To support his growing family, Leonard started work at Pepperell Mill and stood on

principle that led to a boycott of fair wages and work conditions. He wasn't afraid to

stand up for what he believed in or walk alone.

He later joined Uniroyal Tire Plant where he loyally worked for nearly 30 years until he

retired.

Even as he worked diligently, he never let go of his passions. His family pass-time

evolved into the official formation of the Twin Spirituals as they began to travel across

the southeast. In the group made up of his identical twin Clinton Bryant, Charlie B.

Bryant, Rollie "Dandy" Bryant, Rosie Lee Baker, Frank Burton, and Rev Willie Baker he

was the leader and manager of the group. They went on to cut three 45s and one album,

connecting their audiences with their harmonious voices and love of Christ.

Despite his involvement with the group, he still maintained his commitment to his home

church by serving as Green Chapel's Clerk/Secretary, Deacon, Groundkeeper, and

Senior Sunday School Teacher for nearly 15 years.

Leonard's traveling with the group began to take a back seat in 1975 when he accepted

the call into the ministry. On December 14, 1975, he received his certificate of ordination

and started preaching at Elizabeth MBC in Ft Davis, AL and Pleasant Valley in

Camp

Hill, AL. He went on to preach at Mt Traveler MBC in Waverly, AL where he served for

21 years.

At Mt Traveler he always preached the importance of Christian Education. He led the

local level at Ebenezer District as Vice Moderator and Dean and at the state level as

Sunbeam Supervisor. While he did not serve at the national level, he hauled bus loads

every year to the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education. For nearly 35 years,

he traveled across the country to California, Virginia, Oklahoma,

Pennsylvania, Missouri,

Maryland, Texas, Kansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, etc. to name just a few.

Leonard attended Selma University, a Baptist school, also where the Women's State

Convention was located each year. He became a liaison for the University and even

hosted exchange students from Nigeria Africa in his home.

His value of education wasn't limited to only Christian Education; he also knew secular

education could take you far. And his commitment to both wasn't just spoken, it was

lived. He enjoyed reading and often read the dictionary, synonym books, and the

encyclopedia. Leonard also encouraged young people to do well in school by rewarding

students in the community with money for grades earned; \$5 for every A and

\$4 for

every B. It wasn't about the money; it was about encouragement and showing young

people that their hard work mattered. Many children grew up remembering how he

celebrated their achievements, how he pushed them to do their best both inside and

outside of the walls of the church.

Throughout his adult life, Leonard devoted himself not only to his family and work, but

also to the community he loved. Long before retirement, he poured his time and energy

into roles that uplifted and supported those around him. He served as a Boy Scout troop

leader of Troop #340, guiding young boys with the same seriousness, discipline, and

steady encouragement that had shaped his own youth. He fostered a deep passion for

gospel music. With the determination to share that passion with the world daily, not just

on Sunday, he founded, produced, advertised and hosted the 1 st weekday gospel radio

show, The People Gospel Hour, broadcasting songs of faith and messages of hope with

listeners near and far. In his professional life, he took on leadership roles as a union

representative, advocating for fairness and respect in the workplace, a board member of

Department of Human Resources, and later as a recruiter for Royal Federal Credit

Union, later known as Four Seasons FCU at its inception helping individuals

and families

take steps toward financial stability.

Leonard officially retired in 1993, but retirement did not slow him down; it simply gave

him more time to do what he loved most.

He remained deeply involved in the lives of his grandchildren, attending their events and

offering the same wisdom and encouragement he had given his daughters.

His

generosity reached far beyond his family. Leonard often repaired furniture from the side

of the road, restoring pieces that others had discarded and giving them freely to those in

need. He also volunteered at the hospital, offering comfort and companionship to

families, worked as Lee County voter registration, and later became a familiar, welcoming face as a Walmart door greeter. No matter where he was, he

carried himself

with humility and kindness.

On March 31, 2026, after a life lived with generosity and unwavering faith, Leonard

Bryant transitioned from this earthly home to be with the Lord at the age of 91.

Though he is no longer with us in body, his spirit, his teachings, and the love he poured

into others will continue to shine brightly in the lives he touched as his life was a

testament to faith, dignity, and service.

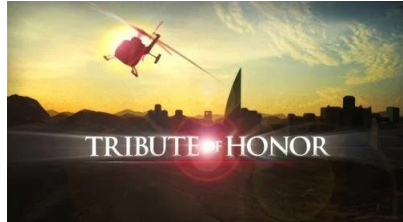
